ADDITIONAL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

High School and Beyond Plan: Students develop a plan for meeting the high school graduation requirements and for connecting successfully to their next steps in life. A student's plan should include the classes needed in preparation for a 2 or 4 year college, vocational or technical school, certificate program, military or the workforce. Specific requirements of the High School and Beyond Plan shall be developed and maintained by the high school administration.

Earn a Certificate of Academic Achievement or Certificate of Individual Achievement: Students earn a Certificate of Academic Achievement by meeting standard on Washington State High School Proficiency Exams. The Certificate of Individual Achievement allows students to use a variety of alternative methods other than the state exams to prove their mastery of learning standards. OSPI maintains an active list of alternative options for the earning of a Certificate of Individual Achievement.

Complete a Culminating Project: This integrated learning project helps students understand the connection between school and the real world. The culminating project will be presented during the senior year and will be scored by a panel of judges. Specific requirements of the senior project shall be developed and maintained by the high school administration.

BE AWARE that meeting high school graduation requirements does not necessarily guarantee that a student will meet eligibility requirements for college or the NCAA. Acceptance of Running Start and Cornerstone credits for college is decided by each college or university. It is important to check with prospective colleges for current admission standards. Most colleges require the requirements outlined by the Higher Education Coordinating Board (HECB), but some will require additional coursework. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Participation in Extracurricular Activities

Students are required to be enrolled and passing a minimum of 2 credits.

Grade Level Placement

Grade level will be based on the year in which a student enters high school, per the Washington State Graduation year in the OSPI database.

To remain on track to graduate in four years, a student must earn a minimum of 6 credits per academic year.

CREDIT RETRIEVAL

Our district is working with the PASS program to help students who are credit deficient. This is an accredited high school curriculum. Students complete paper/pencil study guides outside the school day and then take a test on-line here at the high school. This allows them to earn additional credit and "catch up." There is a fee for these courses. The cost of each .5 credit, semester course is \$150. If students successfully complete the course earning a B- or higher they are eligible for a 60% refund of the tuition. Students earning less than a B- will not be eligible for the tuition refund, but will be able to earn credit. Students must complete all coursework prior to June 15.

Up to six credits may also be accepted from other accredited correspondence high schools.

Request for Elective Credit Waiver

Students who are credit deficient during 1st semester of their senior year may request a waiver for a maximum of 2.0 credits. To be eligible for a credit waiver, students must have passed all courses during their junior and senior year of classes and have completed all of the core requirements.
